The scene beginning in verse 11 is the final and fullest vision John has of heaven.



When Jesus died on the cross, the curtain in the temple tore in two signaling our open access to the most holy place of God – but a day is soon coming when God in holiness will come to us.



The white horse represents conquest and victory.



Jesus' 'faithfulness' and 'trustworthiness' is evidenced by his righteous actions concerning judgment and war.



That his "eyes are a flame of fire" means that Jesus can look right through us with penetrating insight and examine all of our ways. The "many diadems" are the crowns of the nations as he exercises widespread dominion.



Jesus' greatness is so exhaustive to us that even eternity will never be long enough to fully plumb the depths of his grandeur and majesty!



Jesus rides in victory because the battle was already won on the cross.



The "Word of God" means that Jesus is fullest of God's self-revelation.



Jesus is the true "Word of God" as his life communicated the heart of God.



This triple imagery points to the unalterable reality of God's holiness, which demands the undoing of all rebellion and evil. The *sword* illustrates a piercing action; the *iron rod* is an image for rule; and the *winepress* is a symbol of judgment.



Two-thousand years ago, Jesus came to deal with sin; when he returns, Jesus will deal with rebellion.



"...said to the mountains and to the rocks, 'Fall on us and hide us from the presence of Him who sits on the throne, and from the wrath of the Lamb; for the great day of their wrath has come, and who is able to stand?" (Revelation 6:16-17)



The One with eyes of fire will examine our hearts and judge us accurately.
