A Church That Perserveres: 1. Worships a Sovereign Savior (Revelation 2:8-9)



Smyrna means "bitter" and is related to the word "myrrh," which was a sweet perfume used to cover dead bodies.



As the First and Last, Jesus is describing his eternality, which reveals his divinity.

Jesus is reminding them that as the one "who was dead" he also entered into human history and became like one of us.



As a Sovereign Savior (first and last / who was dead), Jesus is reminding us that there is no inch of ground, or one second of time, that he is not reigning or ruling!



God always takes care of us – because in his provisions over death itself, his resurrection has victoriously accomplished everything we could ever need!

2. An Eternal King

Satan is everything that God is not: the very meaning of his name is "adversary" and his **nature** is to lie and his **character** is to steal, kill, and destroy (**John 10**)



2. An Eternal King

He says in verse 10 that all of this is occurring, "...so that you will be tested."

2. An Eternal King

Jesus is both exhaustive in his reign and expansive in his rule.



"Remember this, and be assured, recall it to mind, you transgressors. Remember the former things long past, for I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is no one like Me, declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times things which have not been done, saying, 'My purpose will be established, and I will accomplish all My good pleasure."

(Isaiah 46:8-10)





2. An Eternal King

It is through the testing of trials that our faith grows, our likeness becomes more like Christ, and our testimony enhances the glory of God.

2. An Eternal King

The "second death" is eternal and results in either the paradise of God or separation from God.





In just the last year (2020), there have been:

- Over 260 million Christians living in places where they experience high levels of persecution
- 2,983 Christians killed for their faith
- 9,488 churches and other Christian buildings attacked
- 3,711 believers detained without trial, arrested, sentenced or imprisoned
