A Church Of Compromise: 1. Minimizes Fear (Revelation 2:12-13)



"For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any twoedged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart." (Hebrews 4:12)



"...and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God." (Ephesians 6:17)



"...and He will strike the earth with the rod of His mouth, and with the breath of His lips He will slay the wicked." (Isaiah 11:4)

A CHURCH OF COMPROMISE

revelation 2:12-17



The church was being faithful on the outside, but on the inside they were minimizing sin and compromising their convictions.



The lethal infection was not necessarily the immorality of the few, but the compromise from the whole that tolerated or made excuses for such activity.



Too many times we maximizes the sinner but then minimize the sin.



Pergamum means "thoroughly married."



But how many times has someone been won to Jesus because we condone or endorse the very thing that keeps them from Jesus?



"Truth always carries confrontation. Truth demands confrontation; loving confrontation nevertheless. If our reflex action is always accommodation of the centrality of the truth involved, there is something wrong." (Francis Schaeffer)

This image of the unveiled, exalted Jesus compels us to a whole and healthy view of both fear and sin.



"For those who are according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who are according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit." (Romans 8:5)



Hidden manna suggests that Jesus will always meet our needs.



White stone suggests that Jesus offers us an intimacy that can never be matched by the acceptance and accolades of the world.



What is temporary and unsatisfying in one realm is permanently improved upon in another – in a kingdom established by the eternal presence of Jesus.
